Betty Jonah Orphanage 2010

LCMI greatly appreciates all Supporters and Sponsors of the ministry with your help we are changing lives in Liberia. LCMI wants to give God thanks for all. Thanks to your help in 2011 LCMI has been able to improve the boy's dorm at the orphanage. The LCMI Church Plant is growing in Gbarnga. Schools have just had their promotion ceremonies and plans are being made for the new school year starting in September. We are proud to announce that Emmanuel Lougon, one of the children at Betty Jonah Orphanage, is graduating from High School. He has been accepted to African Bible College, and will start classes there in the next semester. Your support and prayers are doing great things in Liberia.

Updates for Liberia Christian Ministries International:

Betty Jonah orphanage has a new Administrator, Samuel and his wife Naomi Kamara, working alongside Anthony and Betty Jonah at the orphanage.

This year the Boys at the orphanage have gotten new bunk beds, mattresses, and mosquito nets. The bathroom for the boys has been complete and painted. The ceiling in the boy's dorm has been repaired. The orphanage children are doing well.



The Pig Pen at the orphanage is working well. There are now 48 pigs. Some of the pigs have been sold and the orphanage has killed some for food.

The clinic at the orphanage has been completed and painted they are still working to get supplies needed for the clinic. With the Better Clinic LCMI is not only able to help the children at the Orphanage but also have a clinic for the people of Camp 4.

LCMI is now raising funds for a small truck to be sent to the Orphanage. There is a need for this pickup for several reasons. One reason is it will help in gathering wood. Wood is needed daily for cooking. Right now the children and adults have to go and cut or break wood then carry it by hand back to orphanage sometimes a couple miles. Another reason the two orphanage farms are both about a mile from the orphanage and a pickup would help in transportation to and from the orphanage especially in harvest season. There are also a few of the oldest orphanage boys that go to a high school further away from the orphanage and the pickup may be able to help transport the boys to school especially in the rainy season. Those are just a few of the many reasons a pickup is needed. Rev. Anthony Jonah who is one of the founder and worker at Betty Jonah Orphanage is a licensed driver. The goal for the Truck is \$10,000 there has been \$5,910 raised so far if you would like to help with the funds for the truck please let us know.

The orphanage is also in need of a fence around the Orphanage, the outdoor kitchen needs to be refurbished and are in need of a new generator these are projects that we will be working on when funds are received to complete them.

The Randy Godfrey School completed another great year with 184 children completing the 2010-2011 academic year. The School is doing well and is attracting many of the children from the community attending with the children from the Betty Jonah Orphanage. The school is in need of more space. Please be in prayer that LCMI will be able to start work on a new building for Randy Godfrey School adding more classroom space. There is also a need for more text books for Math, Science, and English for grades 4th through 9th grade.

LCMI Church and School is doing well. The LCMI School had 118 students finish the 2010-2011 school year. Classes at LCMI School are grades Nursery through 6th grade. LCMI Church and School are a blessing to many in the New Kaymah Town community. The school has been meeting in the temporary LCMI church building. The government of Liberia is requiring that school have their own building. LCMI School has started making cement block for a building. They have completed 500 blocks. Funds are needed to start the foundation on a school building with eight rooms. At LCMI Church lost souls are being saved through the church's activities each week. It is also encouraging to see lots of people attending Bible study, prayer services, and regular worship services.

LCMI Church in Gbarnga is reaching the people of Chief Compound for Jesus Christ. Since the establishment of the church in Gbarnga members have been meeting in a temporary worship building and have had to move at times. The church is in the process of purchasing 3 lots of land to build a church on. One lot has been purchased and \$1100.00 is needed to purchase the other lots. The land is being cleared and ready to build the building when funds have been donated to purchase the other two lots. Pray for Pastor Cooper Goszlay as he works hard to reach the people in Gbarnga and establish a church.

It is time again to start collecting items for the Christmas Shipment. If you Sponsor a child and would like to send them new clothes or shoes or small gift, put the items in a 2 gallon zip lock bag and send them to LCMI and we will ship the items to Liberia. Items need to be received by LCMI By September 1 with \$10.00 for shipping cost.
